
The French Center for Socio-Political Data (CDSP)

- Created in 2006, Sciences Po and CNRS
- Provides 350 databases in social sciences on the Quetelet-Progedo Diffusion portal (CESSDA provider)
 - Elections results
 - Qualitative and quantitative studies
- About 20 engineers in 3 teams :
 - Data collection
 - Data sharing
 - Digital projects

Secondary use of our data

A growing demand :






Secondary use of our data

Demands:

- o 60% in France
- Rest is mostly from Europe and North America
- 25 countries in total

Project distribution by country




Secondary use of our data

- Universities
- Research organization

Status of the applicant



The past work

- A satisfaction study (2019):
 - In collaboration with PROGEDO, Ined and Adisp
 - Quantitative survey
 - 362 responders (10,3% of the portals users)

Results

- 91% satisfied or very satisfied of the service
- 86% find the documentation useful or very useful
- 25% have difficulties to find the data they want
- Almost 70% have heard about the services by coworkers or in classes

- The idea:
 - Explore further the user experience
 - Qualitative methodology => interviews
 - Focus on the FAIR problematics : metada, accessibility

Methodology:

- First wave launched at spring 2021
- Target: users who have downloaded one or more studies in 2020/2021
 - 9 responders at the end of summer
 - 6 interviews finished
- Semi-directive survey
 - List of questions to ask, with large freedom of response
 - Recoding in several variables

Results:

- Variety of users and projects
- Confirmation of the satisfaction
 - Quality of data
 - Quality of metadata standards that make a second use possible and as easy as possible
- Other expectations
 - O Better communication on the existence of the data centers :
 - Accessibility is also about knowing that the data exists
 - Databases oriented toward education

And the future



- What we have already done:
 - Production of pedagogic databases, focused on learning how to manipulate data
 - Diffusion and communication about our services : Mate-SHS network, Dataweek
 Progedo, ponctual presentations
 - Partnership with other french universities through the 14 Academic Data Platforms (Plateformes Universitaires de Données)
 - Provide our metada in free access on our new dataverse
- What we are going to do:
 - A second wave of interviews
 - More pedagogic databases...
 - More partnerships...
 - And more communication!
